Founder's Night Success


The Lodge Annual Founder's Night was a sell out occasion and, once again, a fantastic night of celebration, reunion, recognition and promotion.

Lodge Charitable Giving



With the assistance of the Freemasons Foundation the Baden Powell Lodge has been very successful

over the past 12 months to support a number of worthy causes. This is in addition to the regular minor donations the Lodge provides to various initiatives and causes such as the District Charity.



With the great work undertaken in Wor. Bro. Charles Charalambous' year the Tende Beck Scout Group (focussed on bringing scouting to young people with disabilities and special needs) was donated \$10,000 towards much needed repairs on their Scout Hall. This was presented in November last year.

The charity during V.Wor Bro. Russell Bradd's year as Master was the restoration Cleve Cole Hut at Gilwell Park. "Cleve Cole has a long and deep history with both Scouting and Freemasonry. As a Scouter and adventurer, he founded the "Lone Scout Section" for those in the movement who, due to their location, were unable to attend their regular Scout meetings. He was also the foundation treasurer of our Lodge.



A cheque to the value of \$11,450 was presented during our Founder's night this year.

As mentioned earlier the Lodge managed to raise £1,000 to assist the repatriation of Jam Roll & Eccles to Scouting the UK.



The Lodge preparing an application to the Foundation to bolster monies already raised for the Junior Diabetes Research Foundation (JDRF).

We are also hoping to raise in excess of \$10,000 for the acquisition of defibrillator machines for various Scout Camps around the state.

Budget Benefits

The finance sub committee have been working hard over the past few years to ensure financial resilience of the Lodge through some great work on the Budget.

Under the direction of our treasurer, Bro. Doug Waldron, and the support of our Planning & Committee of General Purposes there have been a number of successful initiatives to bring the budget under control.

As a result of this work the Finance committee are hoping that, as of next financial year, every meeting (including Founder's Night) will be free for members.

Last month six of our brethren were fortunate to join with the Monash Gully Masters Group in conjunction with Bendigo Freemasons to commemorate the lives and sacrifices of Australian Armed Service men and women.

The event, entitled "Dig Deep For Legacy", consisted of a historic lodge meeting 62 meters underground in the Central Deborah Gold Mine in Bendigo, Victoria where the ceremony of the Unknown Soldier was carried out, followed by a fantastic fundraiser dinner to raise funds for the important work that Melbourne Legacy does to support war widows and families.

The State President of the Blue Lounge Social Club Bro Jack Nathan Aquilina was invited to be the honorary guest speaker at the fundraising dinner where he spoke about the legacy of those fallen hero's who have died in conflicts past, the lessons that Freemasons Victoria has imparted to change his life and why the craft is more relevant than it has ever been.

MWBro Bob Jones, Past Grand Master of Freemasons Victoria, provided an introductory speech which was well received by all.







April Meeting

Our April meeting was one of mixed emotions as we learnt of the journey that Saad & Omar Al Kassab took from war torn Syria to Australia.

The young men fled with their family from the bloody civil war in Syria to Egypt via Lebanon before eventually seeking refuge with an uncle in Australia in 2013.

The brothers were also part of the Syrian Scouts

and provided food and aide to those affected by the bloody war. Their scout leader was kidnapped and tortured to death during a

targeted attack when police caught wind of the humanitarian work being carried out.

Saad & Omar talked about learning English by watching the parliament question time.

Both young men are continuing their links with Scouting by becoming active members of the Cleve Cole Rover Crew.

Neville also had a long and distinguished connection with Rotary International which he joined in 1978 and amongst other activities, led three teams of volunteers to Papua New Guineas, erecting school buildings and dormitories at Popandetta.

Along with his Masonic awards and achievements Neville has also been recognised by receiving:

- Service above Self Award (Rotary)
- Medal of Merit & Bar (Scouts)

It was fantastic to see Neville at the Lodge. Over the past many years he has been occupied in caring for his wife, Helena, who sadly passed away in June last year.
